General Information Note No 1

1. Place and dates of the Congress

The World Tourism Organization and the Government of the Republic of San Marino are jointly organizing the 1st UNWTO Conference on Accessible Tourism in Europe (hereafter referred to as the "Conference"), scheduled to take place in San Marino on **19-20 November 2014**.

The Conference will take place at Kursaal Congress Centre, Viale J.F. Kennedy, 17 – 47890, San Marino, Republic of San Marino, (<u>www.cvb.sm/en</u>; www.centrocongressisanmarino.sm/on-line/en/home.html). **The opening ceremony** will take place at Kursaal Congress Centre on Wednesday **19 November 2014, at 09:30 a.m.**

3. Replies to invitations

The Governments or other bodies and individuals invited by the letter of the Secretary-General of UNWTO and Minister of Tourism of the Republic of San Marino are kindly requested to **pre-register online**, by completing the registration form available at <u>www.sanmarinoaccessibletourism.com</u>, no later than 24 October 2014.

4. Registration on the spot

The registration desk will be located at Kursaal Congress Centre (Ground Floor – Main Entrance) on the day of the Conference and will be open from 8:00 a.m. on 19 November. The access to the Conference to those delegates who have **not previously registered online** and received the corresponding confirmation **cannot be guaranteed**.

Identification badges will be issued on the spot. Participants are requested to wear their identification badges throughout the Conference in the areas reserved for the meetings and all social events.

5. Status of participants

All participants of the Conference shall have the right of unimpeded entry into and exit from the Republic of San Marino. The Republic of San Marino undertakes to urge Italian Authorities to issue, upon request by the interested individuals, the necessary visas required to enter Italy.

6. Entry formalities

The entry into the Republic of San Marino from within Italy is not a subject to any border control between the two countries. However, participants may apply for a visa to enter Italy, if required by the latter. The Italian consular authorities will issue visas to delegates attending the 1st UNWTO Conference on Accessible Tourism in Europe at the corresponding Embassies/ Consulates of Italy, according to the legislation of the European Union.

Countries whose citizens are exempt from the visa requirement for short stays:

Nationals of the following countries **do not require a visa** for visits to Italy up to a maximum of 90 days, for tourism, meetings & conferences, business, or sports events and study purposes:

Albania, Andorra, Antigua and Barbuda, Argentina, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Brazil, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Croatia, El Salvador, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (FYROM), Guatemala, Honduras, Hong Kong, Israel, Japan, Malaysia, Macao, Mauritius, Mexico, Monaco, Montenegro, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Northern Marianas, Panama, Paraguay, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Serbia, Seychelles, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan, United States, Uruguay, Venezuela. The exemption from visa obligation for citizens of Taiwan is applied exclusively to holders of passports with identity card number included.

Citizens of Albania, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia are exempt from visa obligation only if the passport contains biometric data.

This does not apply to citizens of **Serbia** holding passports issued by the Serbian Coordination Directorate ("Koordinaciona uprava").Nationals of **the Holy See** and **Switzerland** do not require visas in any case.

7. Access to the Republic of San Marino

The Republic of San Marino is located in central Italy, at the distance of 10 km from the Adriatic Sea. The country has only road connections with Italy.

By plane

Several airlines operate direct flights from major European airports to the BOLOGNA AIRPORT (BLQ) which is the most serviced airport in the vicinity of the Republic of San Marino. The international airport of RIMINI-SAN MARINO (RMI) operates only charter flights.

From Rimini, take A14 highway, exit "Rimini Sud" and then follow direction for "Repubblica di San Marino" (21 km distance).



8. Welcome at the airport and transfers

Participants will be offered, on arrival and departure, a **complimentary shuttle service between the airports of Bologna and Rimini and Rimini Railway station and the official hotels** of the Conference. There will be representatives of the host country with sign boards with name and logo of the Conference.

To enable the San Marino authorities to properly organize the welcome and shuttle services, participants must complete and submit the online registration form (<u>www.sanmarinoaccessibletourism.com</u>) indicating their arrival and departure information and their accommodation details, before Friday, 24 October 2014. Otherwise, participants will be responsible for their own transfer arrangement.

9. Accommodation

15. Practical information

- Local currency and exchange rates: The official currency of San Marino is Euro (EUR). The exchange rate applicable in August 2014 is approximately 1,24 USD to 1 EUR.
- **Banks** are open Monday to Friday approx. From 8:30/13.00- 14.30/15:35. ATMs (cash machines) are also widely available around the city and shops accept major credit cards.
- Weather: San Marino has Mediterranean climate. In November, the average maximum temperature is 13 °C and the average minimum is 5 °C. It may rain.
- Official language: Italian
- Local time in San Marino: GMT +1
- Electricity: Electric power in San Marino is 220 volts, 50 hertz alternating current. Outlets take plugs with two round pins. In any case, most hotels have adaptors for different plug types. Please make sure that the electrical devices you will be using (computers, mobile phone chargers, electric shavers...) are suitable for this voltage, otherwise transformers or batteries are advisable.
- Health requirements and precautions: No vaccinations are required to enter San Marino.
- **Medical services:** San Marino has good hospital services and a medical emergency centre. The venue of the meeting will have a medical service available on the spot.
- **Optional tours:** There will be a Consorzio San Marino 2000 travel service desk at the Kursaal Congress Centre for those delegates who wish to book optional tours. (see Annex 1).

RIMINI half day tour (wheelchair friendly tour)

Rimini, less than half an hour from San Marino, is a Roman city, not just any, but one of the most important cities of ancient Rome. After initially a strategic colony, it is elevated to the status of municipium in 90 BC and became a thriving city of the Roman Empire. She had a great forum (Piazza Tre Martiri) and two main areas, the cardo maximus (Via Garibaldi and Via IV Novembre) and decumanus maximus (Corso d'Augusto). But also a large amphitheater always packed (only the Colosseum had larger dimensions) and two triumphal monuments, Tiberius Bridge and the Arch of Augustus.

SAN LEO half day tour

The silence and serenity of the 9th century Pieve (parish church) reigns throughout San Leo, even in the hearth of town, birdsongs is the loudest noise. Walk from the town square, past shops selling the sculpture and paintings of this City of Art, along flower-lined lanes to a garden of remembrance surrounded by an unforgettable panorama of valleys and hillsides. Above all towers and the mighty castle where the alchemist Count Cagliostro was imprisoned until his death.

RAVENNA full day tour (wheelchair friendly tour)

Ravenna is a top quality jewel case of art, history and culture. Ravenna is the city of mosaics and has been included in the UNESCO World Heritage List. This form of art not only was born here but it found here its highest expression in a mixture of symbolism and realism, Roman and Byzantine influences and today this ancient knowledge lives again in the hands of students and craftsmen.

URBINO full day tour

Urbino is visible from miles around, the spires and turrets of its fairytale ducal palace crowning the hill on which this ancient university city has sat for so many centuries, dominating a magnificent panorama of green hills and towering mountains. The capital of Montefeltro dynasty, the great rivals of Malatesta, Urbino was also the birthplace and early home of incomparable painter Raphael, and the ducal palace houses one of the world's great art collections, including masterpieces by Raphael, Titian and Piero della Francesca.
